RE: FY17 Budget - Statewide Housing Court

Dear Members of the FY17 Budget Conference Committee:

As members of the Metropolitan Mayors Coalition, we are writing to urge you to include funding and authorization in the FY2017 budget for the expansion of the Housing Court to communities who presently do not have access to this forum.

If approved, this would provide our communities with access to a court specializing in housing matters for the first time. Our cities have large stocks of rental housing and our District Courts have very high eviction caseloads. There is a significant need for the expertise in landlord-tenant matters that Housing Courts provide.

Housing specialists are trained to provide services to both landlords and tenants that allow for a fairer court process between the two and often save landlords from costly eviction proceedings while protecting tenants from homelessness. The programs unique to the Housing Court, such as the Tenancy Preservation Program and Lawyer for the Day, not only assist landlords in retaining their tenants and stabilizing tenancies for the very vulnerable, but also afford critical legal services to those unrepresented. Moreover, in preserving tenancies, taxpayers are saved millions of dollars on expensive items like motels, homeless shelters and emergency room visits.

The expertise that resides within Housing Courts also helps municipal officials deal more effectively with health and safety violations. In fact, it allows for the quicker revitalization of dilapidated and abandoned properties which bring housing back into use and in turn, increases tax revenues. This is particularly important in our municipalities which often struggle with an inventory of distressed buildings.

The Governor and the Senate have included both funding and authorization to expand the Housing Court. We ask that you adopt Outside Sections 140-145 in the Senate's FY17 Budget which would authorize the expansion statewide and Line Item 0036-0003 in the Senate's FY17 budget of \$1.2M for the costs associated with the expansion.
